PASTORAL MESSAGE

Does Love make the Festival go around?

I am always exhausted and impressed by what we are able to do in this annual "Heritage Festival." The spirit of volunteerism is alive and well here. I want to extend my personal admiration and thanks to all of our volunteers, and especially to our amazing Festival Committee. Wow! Now comes the assessment. Everyone wants to know, "How did we do? Did we earn a lot of money?" The answer is, of course, that we did earn some money. But, beyond the money, we also touched a lot of people. More than ten thousand of them! They ate good food (everyone I talked to thought the food was great), listened to some very good "ethnic" music, danced, bought some stuff, toured the Church, saw some things that challenged and informed them, and hopefully came away having had a good time. Hopefully, more importantly, they also saw a group of people, many of us of Greek descent, who are Christians, sharing a rich cultural heritage and a commitment to Christ that fills us with light and love. Hopefully they saw people working together in love, and hopefully they felt our love and concern for them.



They witnessed something that is becoming harder to find in our culture. They saw "community." They saw people who are united by old-fashioned traditional family ties, and they saw that those ties extend beyond physically related family to the spiritual family of the Church community. Community. People who are united in outlook and values. People who care about each other. People who work together for a common cause. Not on-line, but face to face. People who worship God together, talk to each other, eat and drink together, argue with each other, embrace each other, support each other.

Fr. James and I wandered around, but we spent a lot of time in the Church. Many people came by. We got more "people time" in three days than we usually get in a month! Many of the questions were the same. For instance, "How are you different from the Roman Catholic Church/Protestants/Etc.?" I would jokingly tell people, "That's easy. We are right and they are wrong!" Some challenged us about uniquely Orthodox elements in our Faith. Icons. Some wanted to know how "progressive" we are. We are not. Many were curious, some wanted prayer or counsel. For many people, this was certainly their best and maybe only exposure to our precious Orthodox Faith. It was a chance for them to gain a new understanding of the history and diversity of Christianity and of our authentic positions and practices. For some, this might have been a rare opportunity to encounter Christ.

This was true in the Sanctuary, but this was also true for every one of us as we worked in community. We were all sharing ourselves and our Faith, no matter what job we did. So, we were not only "fund-raisers," not only festival workers, cooks and servers, but we were all ministers. We were all "evangelists." We were sharing Christ with our neighbors. Even if we did not say a word, our presence, our dedication, our smile, our willingness to serve, even our silence, and our patience in dealing with the public (it does take a lot of patience, doesn't it?), said who we are and Who we represent. When St. Francis of Assisi (Roman Catholic, I know!) sent his followers out to minister to the poor and the downtrodden, he told them: "Preach the Gospel, and if necessary, use words." We are all "ambassadors" for the Lord Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5:20).

Sometimes this world is a harsh place. Most of the time, in spite of our news medias' emphasis on violence and tragedy, the world is not THAT bad, but in the face of cruelty and pain, it is all the more important that we dedicate ourselves to being "peacemakers" (Matthew 5:9). Being part of Christ, a member of His Church, makes our lives better and makes our world a better place. Through the Church, we find the guidance and strength to live in this world. I pray that you understand and value what we have, what God has given us. Our faith and this Church community are gifts. In this way, if we see despair, then we can tell others of the hope that lives within us (1 Peter 3:15). If we see pain, then we can show kindness; lies, honesty; anger, forgiveness. Wherever we go, we carry Christ with us. We are His hands, His feet, the instruments of His love. Do you feel like you fulfilled that purpose and calling at the festival? Through the frustration and sore feet and all the time spent, hopefully something truly good and useful was accomplished in those who came. Hopefully they saw in us what they truly need. Everyone needs to know God through His Son, Jesus Christ, and everyone needs a loving community.

Building Loan Balance as of 10/17/19: \$3,348,263.09 at 4.19% interest

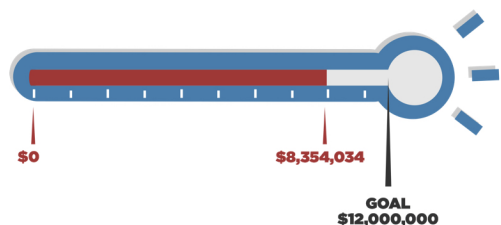
Interest paid in 2017 \$219,010

LOOKING TOWARDS OUR CENTENNIAL

"There are no winners and losers in a war....."

Said Kenji Sudo, a Japanese native who has researched and told the story of one of Sacramento's native sons, Lt.jg SABRE (Sava or Sam) LEGATOS, a USN Pilot who was killed during the war. The aerial combat where two pilots of different countries in the war 75 years ago dedicated their lives together for their families and their respective countries.

"They crashed near my mother's house," said Kenji, "after a fierce battle, and both died, Lieutenant (j.g.) Sava Legatos and Japanese ensign Matsunaga."

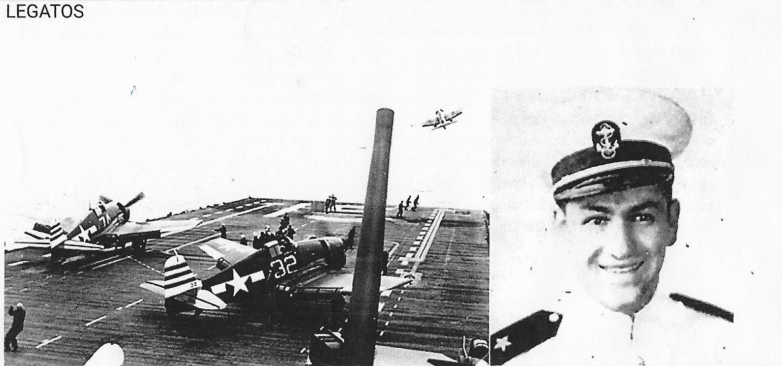
Kenji will be in Sacramento on November 7th at the ASL Luncheon to tell this fascinating local history story. Barbara Taylor, niece of Lt. Legatos will be a guest as well.

The Legatos name is well known in the history of the Annunciation. Tony, a moving force in the relocation of the parish from N Street to the current Alhambra Boulevard location as well as Fred Legatos who is well known for his ever-present volunteer work at Greek Food Festivals and endless "fix-it" projects at the Church.

Greeks-in-Foreign-cockpits is a Greek-American publication (<https://www.greeks-in-foreign-cockpits.com>) that for seventeen years has researched the story of Legatos as well as others who fought for our Country. Volume C will be published in 2020 and carry the full story.

Special thanks to parishioner Nick Alexander who has reached-out to Kenji Sudo and is responsible for taking an interest in the Legatos family history and bringing this fascinating story to our attention.

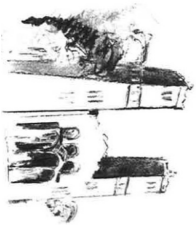

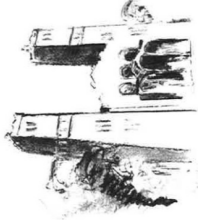

GREEK SCHOOL

Full is a busy time of year for Greek School students, who, in addition to their weekly language instruction and assignments, are also preparing for the OXI Day (October 28th) celebration. As in previous years, Greek School students presented a program to the Annunciation community during a luncheon co-sponsored by GAPA and Greek School. This year, the program began with our preschool students marching into the Hall, holding Greek flags and singing patriotic songs. Following the performance of songs that are inextricably tied with the history of World War II in Greece, Annunciation Greek School students recited poems commemorating OXI day, and presented a narrative of events offering insight into what followed Metaxa's bold defiance of Benito Mussolini's ultimatum: the "Battle of Greece"—a battle that British military historian Sir John Keegan described as "decisive in determining the [. . .] course of the Second World War." The Greek School program concluded with a keynote address by Greek School Director Prof. Katerina Lagos, an expert in modern Greek history and the Metaxas dictatorship. As the OXI Day Program revealed, the curriculum of Annunciation Greek School integrates language and culture, and exposes students to all aspects of Greek culture—from Greek history and literature, to Greek folklore. The Greek School administration wishes to thank GAPA for their support and collaboration!


