PASTORAL MESSAGE

Little Eyes Are Watching Us

Happy New Year to you all! Καλή χρονιά! ¡Feliz año nuevo! May the Lord Jesus Christ be welcomed in your life and in your home. May the Lord bless you in this coming year. Let's hear it for new beginnings!

Speaking of beginnings, allow me to ask you a question: Are you a Christian? How did that begin? Why are you a Christian? People are not born Christians. What influenced you? Were you raised as a Christian? Were you raised Orthodox? Who introduced you to the Lord Jesus? Some of us become believers as adults. Most of us grew up in Christian families. I was brought up in a Protestant Christian home. My parents were serious believers who lived their faith. They attended Church every Sunday. They were involved. They introduced me to Christianity. They weren't perfect, of course, but they tried to live up to what they had received. I know that one of the reasons I am a Christian today is that they planted those seeds in my heart when I was a child.

In recent years, social scientists have studied how faith gets transferred from one generation to the next, and now we have a clearer understanding of that process. But the importance of transferring Faith is something we Christians have always known. As the Rev. Billy Graham said years ago: "God has no grandchildren." Christianity is only as strong as the present generation. Young people typically need to have several key experiences in their lives to make it more likely that they will follow the Faith of their parents. Remember, of course, that there are no guarantees. People make choices.

One of the key experiences in successfully transferring Faith to children is the example of family who believe. (Note: Fathers especially have a tremendous influence on the faith of their children.) So, then, how are you, how are we, helping your children, grandchildren, godchildren, any young people you have contact with, to be practicing Orthodox Christians? This must mean that you bring your children or grandchildren to Church often. Church is essential, foundational. But Church is not enough. An hour plus of religion on Sunday morning will not be very effective if that experience is not reinforced every day. Remember that children typically receive no other Christian education in our modern culture. Does the public school affirm their faith in God? Far from it. Television? Music? Computer games? Books? These days it is crucial that a child's home be a faith friendly environment.

How do we do this? We have answers! An Orthodox solution is providing sacred space. Our Orthodox homes have a prayer corner with icons and holy books, symbols of Faith. It is, however, more important that we USE the prayer corner daily. Do you live your Christian faith? How? If your Orthodox Christian Faith is central to your life, if you pray, if you try to follow Christ's commandments, if you are engaged in the struggle against sin, if you are living the Faith, then your children or grandchildren will see Faith in action, and they will understand that it is very important to you. They will see that Christ is the center of your life. By believing, you encourage them to believe. You are the example. You are the regular reminder, the sermon. And you have way more influence on your kids than you think.

Consider an illustration of this. Every Sunday Fr. Vincent and I see adults bringing small children up for Holy Communion. It always confuses us when the adult does not receive Communion. This often leads to the child refusing to receive, and we do NOT want to "force" children to receive Communion! We coerce children to do many things, but we cannot force them to worship God. The last thing we want is to provoke a screaming tantrum at the holiest point in the service. What to do? Small children are often just problematic no matter what, but believe us, if you will prepare and receive Communion first, and the child watches you, your example will lead them to want to receive. Be very patient. They will get the correct idea that this is not just some kind of "medication" that adults force on children, but this is a great blessing for everyone who is a member of the Body

of Christ, adults and children. We have seen this work! Are you confused about how to prepare? Talk to us! Unconfessed sins? Call us! Don't fast? Shame on you! And please remember that we know that small children are saboteurs of the best intentions to focus on spiritual things or get to Church on time. We understand. God understands. As Fr. Vincent is fond of saying "If the Church isn't crying, the Church is dying!"

Remember that you do not have to be perfect. None of us is adequate. You might sin; you might get angry with your children, but then you could come to them in humility and ask for their forgiveness. As I look back on my childhood, this is one of the things that impressed me most about my dad. The tough former Air Force Sergeant could be cranky and demanding, but when he crossed the line, he would come to me and tell me he was wrong and ask me, a child, for forgiveness. My respect for him soared. Even when he failed, I got the message that his heart belonged to Jesus.

The eyes of young people rest on us. Children want to see evidence that this Faith business is real. They want to see the power of God. Is God real? Does Christianity work? We say yes to them more by what we do than by what we say. Talk to them, but be the example. Lead your children, your grandchildren, your godchildren to Christ. Come to Church, and then Monday through Saturday, do what you can to be a Christian, for your sake and for the sake of your young people. Make your home a Christian home by living your Faith in the New Year and through these coming months into Great and Holy Lent and to Holy Pascha. Do you need some ideas about how to do this? Call or email us. Visit our bookstore. Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire you with creative ideas. This ministry belongs to all of us.

STEWARDSHIP FACTS

Q: DO MY RECURRING STEWARDSHIP PAYMENTS ROLLOVER FROM YEAR-TO-YEAR?

A: In past years, recurring stewardship payments have NOT rolled over to the next year and stewards were required to create new pledges and payments at the beginning of the year. For 2025, recurring payments from 2024 will continue on unless stopped by the giver. If you would like to check your 2025 stewardship status or make changes to your recurring payment, please login to your PushPay account at pushpay.com/login or contact the Annunciation Financial Office at accounting@annunciationsac.org.

Q: WHAT DOES MY STEWARDSHIP PAY FOR?

A: In 2025, it will cost approximately \$3,500/day to keep the church open. Most operating expenses are paid from stewardship. Some examples are utilities, office staff and pastoral salaries, candles, permits, security, and facilities maintenance. Additional costs are directly related to church-funded ministries and programs.

Q: I ALREADY PAY FOR GREEK DANCE, GREEK SCHOOL, ETC. WHY DO I HAVE TO ALSO PAY FOR STEWARDSHIP?

A: These programs operate independently from our general operating budget. The church provides the facility, in addition to facility-related expenses, enabling their operation and receives no money from these ministries. It is also important that families participating in our children's ministries be currently pledged stewards.

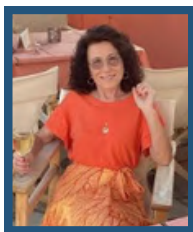

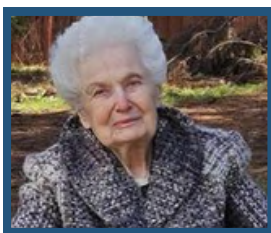
Philoptochos News

Our Warm Coat Drive: The members of Annunciation's Philoptochos want to thank our parishioners for contributing warm coats for the children of the Leataata Floyd Elementary School. To date, we have been able to provide 40 coats for children of all ages who attend the school.

Wellspring Women's Center: For many years, our Philoptochos chapter has supported local charities that serve those in need. Wellspring Women's Center in Oak Park, a recipient of our support for several years, has provided "*respite and services based on hospitality with dignity and love since 1987.*" Wellspring serves nearly 200 women and children each weekday and offers four different programs: the Nutritious Meal Program, the Children's Corner Program, the Safety Net Services Program, and the Women's Wellness Program. The members of Philoptochos have provided monetary donations, diapers and/or hygiene products, and boxes of toothpaste donated by our beloved member, Helen Nickolson, who passed in 2024.



During these years that we have supported Wellspring, Bess Kerhoulas, a beloved member of the Annunciation parish and Philoptochos, crocheted baby blankets for babies of mothers who attend Wellspring. A special thank you to Bess' daughter, Susan, and her husband, Darius, who for many years, accompanied Bess to church with a trunk load of blankets. Sadly, Bess passed on November 13, 2024, at 100 years of age. We will miss her beautiful and generous spirit. On a happy note, Susan has been volunteering at Wellspring bringing her knowledge and talent of sewing and weaving to the mothers who attend there.



Our Homebound Parishioners: Have you ever wondered why you haven't seen a parishioner for a long while either attending a liturgy, participating in coffee hour, or an ASL luncheon? Sometimes it's circumstances that prevent them from attending or an illness that keep them in their homes for long periods of time. Our priests keep the members of Philoptochos up to date on the parishioners they visit due to illness or mobility issues so that we, too, can visit with them. For many years, our members have gotten together to bake Greek pastry, make cut out cookies with our Sunday School children and shopped for beautiful baskets and boxes to hold baked goods, candies, lotions, wash cloths and items that make Easter and Christmas a joyful time for our homebound parishioners. On December 13th, several Philoptochos members gathered in the large kitchen to fill,
